

NEW HUMANITY

The decadence of the models supporting development over the last century is now evident, as are the strategies developed by design culture to ensure that a system with globally-visible weaknesses survives. For years Design has worked to safeguard consolidated methods of consumption, creating concepts of beauty, ideas of well-being and future metropolis, architecture, interiors and products.

The Design culture, alongside industry, has accepted the logics, mechanisms and values of this, assuming a problem-solving role and often renouncing any tendency to doubt the basic paradigms of production, distribution and consumption systems.

In historical moments of industrial history that inclination has opened new ways to the “objects and homes” of man.

Our proposal for this competition is to “divinely capture” the urgent needs required by the great transformations in act from the discipline of design; micro projects able to illustrate possible futures based on paradigms and values relating to a different idea of living:

- new ways of making and producing
- new uses of materials and energy
- renewed ideas of beauty and wellness
- new ways of distributing, possessing, accessing, consuming and using...
- small projects containing some indication of a new design season for the “objects and homes” of a New Humanity

AUDIENCE

The competition notice is open to candidates with a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree or a Level I Academic Diploma (or who are waiting to attain this qualification within the last session of a.y. 2013/14) in the areas of architecture and design.

DELIVERABLES

- A drawing that fully represents your design idea
Candidates are also required to submit:
- Personal portfolio of works and projects: (maximum 3 candidate's best projects)
- Detailed curriculum vitae
- Motivation statement
- Copy of Degree Certificate and/or Academic Transcripts
- NABA Two-Year MA Programs Application Form - Academic Year 2015*

Candidates are asked to send their materials in English or Italian language and in two files in PDF format: one including competition project and one including the remaining materials.

** Application fee is waived for competition participants*

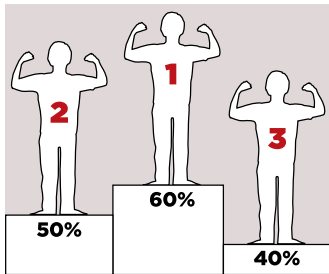
JURY

Projects will be evaluated and selected by the Faculty of the Two-year MA in Design - Product Design.

PRIZES

The three best projects will be awarded a scholarship for partial coverage of the tuition fee to attend the first year of the MA in Design - Specialization in Product Design starting in January 2015.

- 1st prize: n. 1 scholarship covering **60% of the tuition fee** to attend the first year of the MA Program
- 2nd prize: n. 1 scholarship covering **50% of the tuition fee** to attend the first year of the MA Program
- 3rd prize: n. 1 scholarship covering **40% of the tuition fee** to attend the first year of the MA Program.



Scholarships can be extended to the second year of the program, as long as the students meet the required standards, namely 27/30 average of marks and a total of 40 credits of passed exams in the fall session of the academic year 2014/15.

ELIGIBILITY

Candidates holding a first-level academic diploma or BA degree, or about to graduate within the academic year 2013/14 and with a knowledge of the Italian/English language (according to the medium of instruction of the program) equal to a B2 Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

- Every moral or paternity right as to the project remains property of the author. The projects sent to NABA will not be returned.
- NABA is entitled not to award the scholarship if the projects are deemed not to meet the suitable standards defined by the jury. The jury will judge at its own discretion and its decision is final.
- The scholarship presented in this public announcement can not be combined with other economic reductions offered by NABA.
- The scholarship will be deducted from the balance of the tuition fee.
- The assigned scholarship which will not be confirmed could be transferred to the next candidate in the ranking list.

MASTER OF ARTS IN DESIGN - PRODUCT DESIGN

The two-year MA in Design - Product Design enables participants to complete their training as a designer, establishing an atelier in which the challenges of contemporary design can be experimented first-hand: from the design of a product to actual production, defining design strategies, searching for concepts and materials, creating prototypes. Through theoretical and practical lessons, workshops and seminars students gain an insight into design methodologies and the techniques available to contemporary designer. These are then applied to real projects developed with partner companies.
