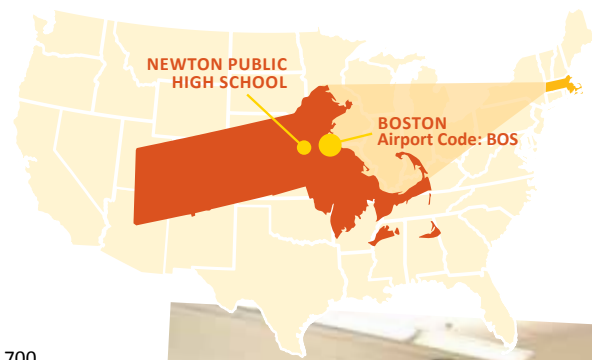

SCHOOL PROFILE

Newton Public Schools is a highly rated school district serving close to 3,600 high school students at two comprehensive high schools. The quality of Newton's educational system attracts families from all over the world. For approximately 20% of our students, English is a second language. The majority of high school students further develop their individual interests through participation in extracurricular activities. Over 60 different opportunities in service, academic, student government and performing arts programs are available as well as 35 varsity sports, encompassing 69 teams. High school science, mathematics, robotics, speech and mock trial teams, as well as theatre productions, compete regionally and nationally. All visiting students attend Newton South High School.
