





Studying **Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences**

The University of Sunderland's long-standing Pharmacy School was founded in 1921, making it one of the most well connected in the UK.

Staff within the Department include qualified pharmacists and research scientists in biomedical science, chemistry, pharmacology, dermatology and

clinical therapeutics.

State-of-the-art facilities include The Living Lab - a unique, purposebuilt environment, housing a mock hospital ward, pharmacy dispensary and examination rooms.



Both of the University of Sunderland's BSc (Hons) courses are accredited by The British Psychological Society (BPS).

Graduates who achieve at least a second class honours degree are eligible for the graduate basis for chartered membership of the BPS. This is the first step towards becoming a chartered psychologist.

Psychology facilities include a cognitive laboratory which includes experimental cubicles, a computing laboratory containing 30 PCs equipped with psychology-specific software such as SPSS, fOCUS II Observation Psychology and PowerLab machines for measuring physiological responses such as heart rate, galvanic skin response and brain activity.
